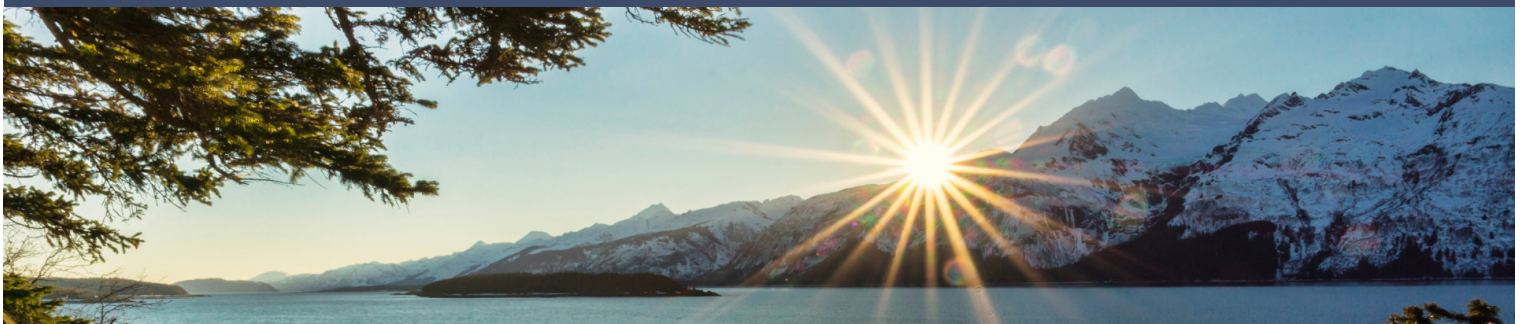

A little further south, you will reach the tiny port of Elfin Cove. Its calm and glistening waters are an unrivalled peaceful haven that the local community of fishermen will invite you to discover.

During the first part of your cruise, *Le Soléal* will continue to clear a path through the Interior Passage and will draw closer to the temperate rainforest on Canada's west coast. This primary forest is a biodiversity hotspot where you will be able to observe numerous species such as bald eagles, black bears, grizzlies, sea otters, humpback whales and orcas. Here you'll find a concentration of life in an enchanting setting of mountains and conifers that is typical of these wild regions.
